Introduction – CityJet

Now You're Flying

- CityJet is a subsidiary of one of the largest airlines in the world, the Air France KLM Group.
- With a fleet of 37 aircraft (22 Avro RJ85 and 14 Fokker 50s), the airline operates a total of more than 680 weekly flights across its European network.

- **Route Networks:**

The airline's operations are centred on its two main route networks:

1. London City Network. CityJet offers a choice of more than 480 flights to and from London's only truly local airport - London City Airport. Under the CityJet brand, passengers can fly to 17 destinations in the UK, Ireland and mainland Europe.

2. Paris (Charles De Gaulle) Network CityJet operates a franchise route network of more than 200 weekly flights from various European cities into the Air France hub at Paris, CDG. The airline operates these routes under the Air France brand.

CityJet also operates a number of Wet-lease and ad hoc routes for Air France, as well as some niche operations and charter flights.

A Truly European Airline

- CityJet, a truly European airline, is headquartered in Dublin, and has offices in Antwerp and London, with staff residing across Europe, in Belgium, The Netherlands, Luxembourg, France, The United Kingdom and Ireland.
- CityJet employs 1059 people, including 305 pilots, 337 cabin crew and 417 ground staff, representing 32 nationalities.
- Its senior management team is led by chief executive Christine Ourmières and deputy chief executive, Michael Collins.
- The company was founded in 1993 and operates a mixed fleet of 38 aircraft comprising Avro RJ 85 and Fokker 50 types across its networks in Europe.
- CityJet operates two main networks – London City and Paris CDG. The London City network services 17 destinations, while the Paris CDG network services 4 main destinations. The airline also operates a number of Wet lease, niche and charter operations.

Introduction – Company History

A Truly European Airline

- Established from a Dublin base in 1993, CityJet commenced services in January 1994, with its first scheduled flights on the Dublin – London City route. In the same year, VLM Airlines began its first scheduled service from Antwerp to London City.
- In early 2000, Air France assumed sole ownership of CityJet.
- In 2007 CityJet announced a major expansion of its London City network with the opening of eight new routes in addition to the existing Dublin and Paris operations.
- In December 2007 CityJet acquired Belgian airline VLM. The complementary networks and airlines have since been combined to become one of the largest airlines at London City Airport, operating under one brand – CityJet.
